## Learn to Wet Felt: Little Felted Vessel

**Description:** Come learn the basics of wet felting. We will learn a bit of felting history, as well as felting "whys and hows." Our hands-on portion will teach techniques such as layout, embellishment, and dimensional wet-felting as we create this sweet little bowl. Measuring approximately 3" across, it is perfect for holding rings or just sitting on a shelf for decoration.

The Instructor: Deb Tewell has a lasting interest in working with her hands and combining fiber with color inspiration. She has learned various felting techniques from master felt-makers and taught many others the craft. Deb enjoys creating wearable art as well as dimensional sculptures. Her work has won numerous recognition ribbons, including Best of Show at New Mexico Arts & Crafts Festival. She enjoys introducing never-ever felters to the craft and has taught students from elementary school to senior living facilities. Deb was organizer of the annual Felter's Rendezvous, an event that brought together nationally-known instructors and students from across the country for four fabulous days of felt-making and fiber camaraderie.
